It aims to involve children, young people and their families in decisions about their care, and improve the support that is available to them throughout their lives.

It was clear to the judges that Sarah Jane's care during her final months had been outstanding. This clearly depended on having a wonderful and loving family, but this alone is never enough. It also depends on that family receiving a huge amount of support and reassurance; on skillful management of physical, emotional, spiritual and social problems; and on planning ahead. The professionals involved in Sarah Jane's care learned from her situation. They developed new ways of working, which will benefit people with learning disabilities in the future.
