Palliative Care for People with Learning Disabilities Network (PCPLD) Statement on the Meacher Assisted Dying Bill

We now have more details of the current Meacher Assisted Dying Bill going through the Westminster Parliament. This would make it legal for an individual with capacity who is not expected to live more than six months to choose to take medication to end their life.

Whatever society through Parliament decides in the future about assisted dying, the PCPLD Network is clear that this specific bill does not protect learning disabled people.

It provides no safeguards to prevent the bias and discrimination that learning disabled people often encounter. Making the wrong decision can often be corrected but making a wrong decision in assisted dying is irreversible.

The Palliative Care for People with Learning Disabilities Network will not support the Meacher Assisted Dying Bill.
