Paul Ridd's Story

Paul Ridd had severe Learning Disabilities, and died on Ward G at Morriston Hospital in January 2009.



"It greatly concerns me that the dire level of care that Paul was subjected to on the ward could happen in the 21st century" – Ombudsman Report, September 2011

Ombudsman's Observations

- No Learning Disability training in place for staff
- Sadly did not see the person, only the disability –
 "diagnostic overshadowing"
- No understanding of a LD patient as a person "unvalued"
- No understanding of how to care for a person with a LD – "ignorance"
- No LD Liaison Nurses
- No LD Care Bundle
- No LD Ward Champions



Why me?



- Grew up with my uncle who had Learning Disabilities
- Work as a Junior Sister on an acute surgical ward (Ward G) in Morriston Hospital (part of ABM University Health Board)
- The Ombudsman Report into Paul Ridd's death was the catalyst that inspired my passion to change and become Ward, Hospital & Health Board Champion for LD and invest personal time in making a difference:
 - "never again on my ward, in my hospital"
 - "knew from my heart"
 - "driven it and made it real"
 - Made a promise to Paul's family

My Vision



- To change acute hospital care for all people with a LD so that they get the best health care possible- in my hospital, my HB & across NHS Wales
- I wanted to make a difference for people with a LD by raising general awareness of the issues that they face
- To provide the highest possible quality care and excellent patient experience
- To help hospital staff to ensure people with a LD receive a fair and equitable service when they visit anywhere within ABMU
- To ensure no other patient or family experiences the care Paul sadly received

What have I done to make a difference?

- Raised Awareness
- Acted as first point of contact within Surgery
- Supported nurses on other wards
- Developed Ward Information Packs for all surgical wards within ABMU
- Delivered teaching sessions
- Provided support for patients, families and carers
- Took part in Hospital Walkabouts
- Assisted in the development of the logo (Jelly Babies)
- Shared positive patient stories and learning with staff across ABMU
- Involvement in Health Board Steering Group
- Assisted in development of Ward Champions
- Worked closely with Jonathan Ridd and Jayne Nichols

What's Next?

- Continue supporting the Champions
- Work more closely with parents, carers and families and make reasonable adjustments to individual care
- Make Learning Disability training mandatory
- Work closely with the Learning Disability Liaison Nurses
- Deliver teaching sessions to nursing students
- Implement a "flagging system" for patients admitted with a LD
- Ongoing development of an E-Learning Platform for LD Training
- Promote the Learning Disability service provided at Abertawe Bro Morgannwg University Health Board and share knowledge and experience with other Health Boards across NHS Wales
- The Paul Ridd Foundation Trustee
